**A Blessed Epiphany to All-**

How good God is to us—first He invites us to SEE the Word-Made-Flesh in the crib with the Shepherds. He then exhorts us with St. John to not just SEE, but to KNOW Him who is born by spending time with Him before the Blessed Sacrament, where we see, and through our conversation in prayer, come to know.

Next on the Feast of the Holy Family we enter into a RELATIONSHIP with Him through others, KNOWING Him through the intercession of Mary and Joseph. We then ‘ponder this in our hearts’ with Mary, the Mother of God, as we gaze upon Jesus and He gazes back at us from the Eucharist in our time of prayer.

Then finally this week, this great mystery is MANIFESTED to the World by the WISE MEN FALLING DOWN IN ADORATION before the child, as we need to understand for our own lives in coming to times of adoration in prayer to become WISE. The whole Christmas season is a catechesis in coming to unite with God through adoration and prayer time—conversation in front of the Blessed Sacrament. Let us invest well in this time so that we might be ready when our Adoration Chapel is completed in June! Come let us Worship!

I was off with some priest friends this past week for a bit of refreshment and prayer, and to pray for all of you, the needs of the Capital Campaign, our youth and our elderly. Let the Christmas Season continue to refresh you—don't be in haste to put away the decorations! This week to come holds the official end of the Christmas season with the Baptism of the Lord, but Christmastide goes till February 2<sup>nd</sup> when we present the Lord in His glory in the temple as the “Light to the Gentiles” — to all the nations!

This week is also Vocations Week—the call to make that Epiphany come alive in the souls of our youth, to make it manifest in their lives in the shape of a religious vocation or call to the priesthood. We must encourage our youth and give them every support to choose a complete gift of themselves for God with their lives—nothing could be better. This was fostered in part last week with having our parish retreat—I hope many of you took advantage of it—the Canons Regulars also had planned to make their rounds in the schools to encourage young people in their discernment.

So let the joy of Christmas now MANIFEST itself through our dedication in adoration, prayer, and planting the seeds of religious vocations and the priesthood for God's greater glory.
