A Blessed Week-end to you all,

On the 29th of June all the priests of the diocese got together with our Bishop for our annual overnight at the Augustinian Retreat Center in Conway. During that time, Fr Dwayne (who heads up the liturgy in our diocese under the Bishop) gave a presentation on the upcoming liturgical changes in our diocese and the throughout the English speaking world with the new translation of the Roman Missal.

Fr Dwayne mentioned that for some, the changes are going to be difficult. But he encourages us all to 'hang in there'. Of particular importance, he mentioned was the point that we are **not 'going back'**. I would sum it up as saying that there is a difference between "pulling out treasures new and old" as Jesus says in scripture, and 'going backwards'. He mentioned that for many it might seem like that—that we are just throwing the renewal out the window. But he emphatically said that that is not the case. We are aiming for enriching our liturgy, and passing on our Tradition with both the new and the old, and correcting certain things along the way, as the Church is ever reforming Herself. He also mentioned that when asked why some of these things are happening, that he says something to the effect that we don't know why the Holy Spirit does what He does in the Church. But what we do know is that we can rest assured if the Church is saying to do this or that, then it is what we should do. That is what makes us Catholic.

I know though that these things or other changes in the parish can be difficult. Having passed on his thoughts, I want to provide an opportunity for anyone with questions or comments on anything to come and voice them. We do have such a great parish full of our own 'treasures, new and old', and as we approach the time of assessing the needs of our parish with things like a new roof, the school, the tower, the bathrooms, etc, I think it essential that we come together as a community. If you or anyone you know in the parish has questions or concerns about the things that I have mentioned or anything else, please come after the 8:30am mass on August 1st to the parish hall. If that time doesn't work for everyone, I would be happy to have another time as well. Let's get together and form a united front as we worship the Lord in Spirit and in Truth.

These are some of the points that Fr Dwayne brought up:

First, that there is a hierarchy of norms or rules in the Church. In other words, there are norms for the Universal Church, norms for the United States, norms for our diocese made by the bishop, decisions that are made on a parish level by the Pastor, and finally choices made by individuals at mass from certain approved options.

The main focus that he spoke about was the new translation of the mass. We still don't have a date, he said, as to when that will be (another year or so). He commented on the approach to how translations are done—that in the old way (the way that we have now) called "Dynamic Equivalency", thought rather than words guides the translation. So the point was to try to get a meaning across. Unfortunately many times this didn't happen. In the new way, called "Formal Equivalency", there is an attempt to get a much more accurate translation of the words as well as the meaning.

On the level of the United States, he mentioned that there are 16 indulgences—16 special permissions that the United States has been given as options at the mass. Some of these include: Communion on the hand (the norm is on the tongue for the universal

church), communion while standing which is the norm for the U.S., (though the norm for the universal Church is kneeling and has been emphasized lately by the Pope), the ability of Extraordinary Ministers to purify the vessels (in 2009 this indult was revoked), and the use of certain musical settings, (the norm is still that chant should take pride of place, even in the United States). Fr Duane mentioned that permission for some of these indults (not necessarily particularly the ones that I listed) might not carry over in the new translation—we'll just have to wait and see.

He also brought up the tricky issue that 'old things are coming back'. For instance the book for the new translation will be called by the old name—"The Roman Missal" and not "The Sacramentary". There will be a dismissal rite (a prayer over the people at the end of each mass) during Lent as there used to be (and still is) in the Tridentine Mass (Extraordinary Form). He mentioned that some of the translations might simply be taken from earlier English editions—back to the 1st edition for instance (an example is "the Lord be with you" and the people answer "and with your spirit"). The option to use "Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again" will probably not be there (it is more of a proclamation where the Lord is doing something, rather than an acclamation "to" the Lord as it should be). He mentioned that the priest will be intoning (singing) things, like the Gloria, and that chant is a great way to learn the new words of the translation. Fr Dwayne mentioned that some of these options are no longer options because of the various abuses that have occurred over the last years. People, priests, and bishops have allowed things that the Church does not allow as options for the mass. So we see that there are going to be more changes than 'just new English words'.

Our Bishop added that at his level, he also will probably be addressing a few points, like standing after communion, or similar things. After being here two years or so, (one as Pastor this coming Thursday, July 15th!) I have addressed a couple of things for our particular parish, as well as made it possible for those individuals who would like to exercise their rightful option to kneel for communion to do so.

I hope to see you all at the meeting on August 1st after the 8:30am mass. If we need to, we can schedule a second time if many aren't able to make it then. Please--feel free to talk about anything. I have no problem with people letting me know their opinions. I would hope however, they also listen to the reason behind things. This is your parish and you should have input into things, and you very well might have insights that could benefit everyone. But we do need to work together.
