A Blessed Feast of the Assumption to Each of You,

Today we celebrate the day that the Blessed Virgin Mary was taken up, or assumed, into heaven, body and soul. So there are two people in heaven with their bodies—Jesus and Mary,—while the rest of us need to wait ‘till the 2nd judgment, also known as the General Judgment, to get our bodies back. The belief that Mary was taken up to heaven in this way is a belief that is necessary for salvation—that we as Catholics must accept it as one of the four Marian dogmas (the other three being her perpetual virginity (before, during and after the birth of Our Lord), her being the Mother of God (not just a man), and her Immaculate Conception (she was born without the effects of original sin). She is a sign of the promises that await us in being taken up to heaven as well. So make sure to wish all those from St Mary's Hannah and Lake Leelanau happy feast day for their parish.

I will be gone this next week--this time on a real vacation instead of a retreat/workshop, with 4 priest friends at a cabin. Fr Matthew Wigton will be here to cover masses.
