**Extraordinary Minister Re-Certification**

All current Extraordinary Ministers, and those who would like to be trained, must attend a class before November 30, 2011 when all current certifications expire. A list of classes is on the bulletin board in the vestibule. **You will not be able to serve after the deadline unless you have been issued a new certificate. There is a 10-day registration deadline before each class to receive your certificate at that time. You may also “walk in” and sign up, but check with the hosting parish first.** You must sign up by September 21st to attend Holy Rosary’s class on October 4th. **Proper Attire for Mass**

Archbishop Jose Guadalupe Martin Rabago of Leon, Mexico, has issued a call for modest and appropriate attire in church. “If you have any respect for this place, dress appropriately,” said the Archbishop. He said that women should not come to Mass in miniskirts or halters, and men should not wear shorts or sandals. Ordinary people know that different dress is expected for different occasions, the Archbishop said, and what is appropriate wear for the beach is not appropriate for a wedding—or for Sunday Mass.

With the coming mass translation in Advent, there'll be an emphasis on the liturgy:

**Choir Practice for Ordinary Form Weekend Masses- Mondays at 6:45pm**  
**RCIA/Catholics Coming Home** w/Deacon, Monday Evenings weekly at **8:15 pm**  
**Catechism/Faith Issues w/Father** (High School)- every **4<sup>th</sup> Monday at 8:15pm**
