 Enrolling in St. Mary School**

A **mandatory** tuition subsidy meeting will be held on Sunday, September 12, 2010 after the 8:30 am Mass in the School for all families with children enrolled in Catholic schools.

Holy Rosary gives a high priority to the Catholic education of all parish children, and in addition to providing Faith Formation classes, we subsidize a portion of the tuition paid by those families whose children attend Catholic schools.

Families to whom a subsidy is given must meet certain criteria set forth by the parish, and is reviewed and renewed annually. It is expected that any parish family anticipating subsidy for their children would be active parish members, having belonged to Holy Rosary a minimum of six months, be attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, be regularly using their envelopes for giving, and be prepared to work the fish and the chicken dinner.

A Blessed Labor day to each of you! In the context of our Catholic Faith we should meditate upon how we are called to "Enter into God's Rest" (Psalm 95). Our whole reason for being here in some degree rotates around entering the Rest of Christ. In a particular way, we remember this each Sunday. That is why keeping the Lord's day holy is such a serious thing. It trains us, each week, to be ready to enter into eternally rest and joy on the Last Day. If we don't take that seriously each week, or on Holy Days of Obligation, we will not be preparing ourselves to die in the sacraments--in the peace of Christ. That is why it is of such serious obligation--that we do no unnecessary work on Sunday, and make sure to put the worship of the Lord in Holy Mass as priority number 1. It is a serious sin to miss mass on holy days and Sundays (Saturday evenings if you can't make Sundays) without a good reason, and working on Sunday can be a serious sin too, depending upon the circumstances.

So let us thank God for the labor that he does give us, and also for the rest that He provides to make sure that we are putting Him first in our lives.

It will be nice to have the Brothers of St John up this weekend--and for me, it is timely, as my Father's wife was in the hospital. So I am going to try to go down and spend some time with them this weekend. Please keep Barbara in your prayers.

We are wrapping up our summer concert series this weekend--what a blessing that has been, and plans are already underway for next year.
