Dear All,

With the rain cascading down, a pastor can still be at ease when he has a new roof! Thanks be to God for it's completion. It is still only phase one of our campaign, but all has gone well. Thanks to all who continue to give—we are just about to cross the \$300,000 mark, and that is with about 95 families. Thanks so much. For those who haven't yet turned theirs in...please make that effort!

A summary of the parish council meeting: Discussion continued on Catholic Schools, and the best way to finance our children's education. A building update was given as the roof and tower were finished: Things went exceptionally well; it was either the best or second-best batch of slate they've ever worked with. Being semi-weathering slate, the more stark colors will fade over the next six months to blend into a nice pattern. The brick, flashing and new drainage plan also went exceptionally well. *Perhaps most exciting was that even with hidden costs (2 major areas on the roof that had rotted, extensive re-building of the four corners of the bell tower, and minor masonry repairs) the total cost of the roof and tower comes to almost exactly our estimate as predicted in the brochure (and maybe a little under). Considering that many times bids such as these go over by 10-15% this is a small miracle.* So 'hat's off' to Grand River Builders. Fixing dents in the lawn, etc, will take place in the Spring, and our beautiful garden out front survived the scaffolding quite well. Next projects will be the paving (though only near the road so as to keep the 'green' on the south side), the chapel, and the plasterwork, as well as the steps outside the Church. The work for that, and some items for landscaping, have been donated by some generous souls. We'll have a parish breakfast Dec. 11 at which we'll welcome newcomers. Work continues on organizing the men's group/ushers, and the new parish council members will be joining the parish council at the next meeting.
