Dear All,

A blessed Lent to each of you,

I wanted to follow up on last week's homily and financial summary that was placed in the bulletin with the various projects we have going on at present that need your attention. The Finance Council report concluded that we could be free of dependence upon the money from the chicken dinner to operate our day to day parish expenses if each one of us would increase their giving by \$1.44 a week- or \$75 a year. I truly hope that each of you will agree that this is a very small sacrifice in light of all the things upon which we spend our money. It would be a great source of pride for our parish to be able to say that we are finally operating as we should--from our Sunday and regular collections, rather than depending upon the chicken dinner.

In fact, this is such a small amount, that I wanted to list the other ways that we could presently use your help. We are still about \$2000 short in raffle prize money for the chicken dinner--doing well but not quite there, so please be generous with this. We hope, barring other projects that might take priority, to turn our attention to the bathrooms downstairs with the raffle proceeds.

A few people had offered to help with the redoing of the steps going down to the basement, and also for the steps outside. As you might have seen, we are just about ready to redo the inside steps. Could those of you who offered to help with this let me know? And if any others could help, it would be appreciated.

CSA--We're about \$5000 out on our pledges, so do try to keep up with your payment schedule if you have fallen behind, and thank you! Thanks for all who donated to the ice rink so far--we are doing well there, but it is not quite complete.

On other financial issues--we just received a letter from the Diocese listing the costs for the ordination of our dear new Bishop. If you are thankful to God for our new Shepherd, perhaps you would want to consider donating to that cause--any and all amounts would be appreciated.

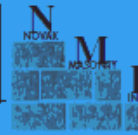

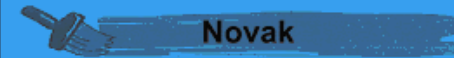
