## FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

JULY 10, 2022

Dear All,

### Who Is My Neighbor?

A priest friend of mine had a statue of the crucified Jesus. In a visit to his home, he offered me a rare viewing of this treasure. As I recall, it stood about 5 feet tall and was draped with a purple cloth. Before unveiling the sculpture, which he kept in a back secluded room, he counseled me that it was very graphic and depicted Jesus in a fashion that would resemble with great accuracy the gruesome wounds that would have been produced by the flogging and crowning with thorns. He suggested that I could decline the view if I chose and that it was because of the vivid detail that he hardly ever exposed the sight to his guests. Needless to say, the viewing did produce an intense reaction. The realization of how much Our Lord actually suffered for us had a deep and lasting effect.

As a physician, I have often been present when a student nurse experiences an open wound for the first time. On at least a few occasions, we have heard a loud clunk from the back of the room during a procedure and turned to find the student lying on the floor. This intense reaction is evidence that we all have been designed to respond to the suffering of our neighbor as if the trauma was occurring to our own bodies. The sight, the sound, and the smell of this trauma seem to be quickly transferred through our sympathetic nervous network to produce these profound reactions. Their pain and suffering can become our own.

In today's gospel, we hear St Luke, the great storyteller, recall the parable of the Good Samaritan, given in response to the question 'who is my neighbor?'. The Priest and the Levite had come upon the bruised and beaten body of the unfortunate traveler who robbers had left for dead by the roadside. Their minds quickly rationalized that it was not their duty or problem and so passed him by. It was the Samaritan who recognized his obligation to his fellow man and, with deep compassion, bound the wounds and brought him to a place where he could be cared for until his healing was complete. The pain and suffering of his neighbor had become his own.

We were told time and again in grade school by our Dominican nuns that we would meet Jesus in the people that sent our way. We would see Him in the downtrodden, the sick, the suffering, the lame, and the mental and emotionally challenged. We would meet Him in the rich and famous, the poor and marginalized, the greatest of sinners, and the greatest of saints. It would not be ours to choose when or where. We might be repulsed by their appearance and want to pass them by and move to the other side of the road. There would always be an ability to rationalize that their care belonged to someone else, to some agency. We were taught that Jesus might present Himself as a person with a special need, and we might be the ones given the unique grace to respond as the Samaritan did to their situation. We needed to see Jesus in them and treat them just as we would if we were caring for Jesus Himself. In compassion, we should see that it is Jesus who is suffering and make His suffering our own.

Mathew 25:34-40 tells it all. "Then the king will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry, and you gave me food, I was thirsty, and you gave me drink, a stranger, and you welcomed me, naked, and you clothed me, ill, and you cared for me, in prison,

and you visited me. Then the righteous will answer him and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? When did we see you ill or in prison and visit you?' And the king will say to them in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me.'

Indeed, it was truly Jesus who was robbed and lay beaten and half-dead on the side of the road. We were the ones who were blessed to find and care for Him. His suffering can become our own, for it is Jesus who is our neighbor!
