In the second half of Lent, e readings come from the Gospel of John and remind us that sus is indeed our Savior. He will save those who know their ed for salvation. In Her wisdom, The Church helps us to focus these readings by quieting everything else. Less organ, wer hymns, lack of flowers, no 'Gloria' and no 'Al--a' provide a period of silence so we may ask ourselves, as St Francis did, /ho are we?" and "Who is God?" The late Pope Emeritus nedict XVI said "Lent is a favorable time in which to discover faith in God as the foundation of our lives and of the urch's life."

actically what does this mean from a musical standpoint? e will put the Heritage Mass away for the Saturday 4 pm ass. We will be using the English chant from the Roman ssal instead. The 8 am will also use the English Chant, as we ve been using it on the 2nd and 4th Sundays. On the first d third Sundays, we will use Mass XVII at 8 am (You member it! We did it during Advent!) We will also use Mass 'll at 11 am. Except for the 4th Sunday of Lent, Laetare nday, we will forgo the opening and closing hymns to foster iet reflection. During Lent, the oir and students will be preparing all the wonderful ocessions, Tenebrae and other sung Holy Week traditions at ly Rosary. It's not too late to join us! We rehearse ednesday nights, and no previous choral experience is required.

As we enter this great season of silence, let us not only listen to what is not there but also what IS there. In still small whispers, as I pray that the Lord will speak to you, please pray for me. -
