For Catholics who have bought into the media's arguments on abortion, this is a good wake-up call. This teaching has been this way since the beginning. If we don't end up chastising our children appropriately, with love, they or we end up killing other children. As Mother Teresa said, abortion leads to nuclear war, so the lack of chastising children leads to abortion because both are about not truly caring for children.

It is beautiful how many people either greeted me 'Hello Father' or said 'Thank you, Father' as I walked around Mackinac, that they were remembering God amidst their recreation. This is what we all want to do, to bring God into everything we do. That is the life of true virtue. We don't want to

compartmentalize our faith; live a certain way at church, but then differently at home or out and about. We all, even though you are not wearing clerics, hopefully, by the way we act, dress, and speak, are living witnesses to the culture of life.


