Greetings everyone,

As Fall is beginning to get cranked up, make sure that we are properly ordered as we go into it. Every season change is a time for a new beginning. The best way to start your fall is with a good confession. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says that we are to go to confession at least once a year. But as we know, anyone truly striving in the spiritual life will find himself going much more frequently. Make sure that you do take advantage of this great sacrament that hits the reset button in our lives, so that we can begin our walk with God in a fresh and bright new way.

As the excitement of school is running through the young people, it is always good for those of us who are older to catch some of that enthusiasm. When was the last time you studied the Faith? Not that you have to get a workbook and do all the exercises in it, but you should always have something you are reading that brings you deeper into the Faith or into the spiritual life. If you are not much of a reader, there are gazillions of podcasts out there. Just make sure that you are listening to podcasts that educate you in the truth of Catholicism and that are not fomenting rebellion or disdain for others. Many a good person has walked over that cliff. Lots of books will have an "Imprimatur" or "nihil obstat," indicating that the book is not harmful to your faith. Also ask your Guardian Angel to guide you in what you read or listen to. Your Guardian Angel's first responsibility in regards to you is to help you get to heaven, so make sure that you ask for his help. For approved readings or at least reputable podcasts.

If you have not yet registered for Faith Formation, please do so. You will note that the diocese has increased the number of hours of participation for those receiving First Sacraments, but do not let

this intimidate you. Here at Holy Rosary, we are trying to make this easy for you. By being faithful to what the bishop asks, there are certainly going to be rewards. First and foremost, obedience leads to a reward in heaven that will be great.
