Fill My Cup, Lord

A woman headed across the desert and lost her way. Thirsty in the triple-digit temperatures, she reached for her canteen. It was empty. The incessant craving for water turned to a dry throat and parched lips. Mirages across the

highway only tantalized her ever-growing need for water. Anxiety and confusion turned to disorientation. She came upon a shack as delirium set in. With her last ounce of strength, she broke in, fell into a stupor, and died only feet from water, the sustenance of life.

The hippocampus is an area of the brain that tells us when we are low on water. Thirst is the message that it sends to let us know that it is time to drink. Our bodies require water for all the processes that take place to keep us alive. Without water, we can only survive 3-5 days under ordinary circumstances. Far less than that in the heat of the desert. The progressive symptoms leading to this woman's demise were classic: thirst, followed by anxiety, confusion, delirium, and stupor.

Michiganders are surrounded by 20% of the earth's fresh water. We have the luxury of never being more than a few miles from a freshwater stream, river, or lake. Rarely would we ever think of dying of thirst. Those who have water in such abundance can afford to thirst for other things. According to psychologists, the symptoms of the thirst for material differ from that of the thirst for water but are nevertheless present. They find that "the more highly people endorsed materialistic values, the more they experienced unpleasant emotions, depression, and anxiety, the more they reported physical health problems, such as stomachaches and headaches, and the less they experienced pleasant emotions and felt satisfied with their lives."

In John 10:10, when Jesus talks of wanting us to have 'life in great abundance,' He is not referring to the material. In Isaiah 55:1, God tells us, "Come, all you who are thirsty, come to the waters; and you who have no money, come, buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without cost." Here He is not offering us a larder of food and drink that will forever satiate our hippocampus. He is not offering bigger homes and cars to satiate our unending materialistic cravings. We have become a society of compulsive consumption. The anxiety and depression that it produces reflect our recognition deep in our spiritual being that trying to fill these cravings is a never-ending struggle. We will never have enough.

The Samaritan woman who Jesus meets at Jacob's well in today's Gospel was thirsty. Jesus offers her 'living water .' Not understanding, she is tantalized by the idea that she would never need to make this trek to the well again. She ventures out at the 6th hour, in the heat of the day, at a time when she can be alone at the well, possibly to avoid the disgrace of having five husbands. Her excitement bears no bounds when she realizes the magnitude of what Jesus was really offering her. Her real

thirst was not physical. She had tried to fill her spiritual cup with things the world taught her to crave. What Jesus offered her allowed her to lay down her burdens. Her incessant struggles for the material were over. The anxiety and depression could forever be gone! I can envision her joyfully running, leaping, and singing to tell her family and friends this wonderful news. A hymn by Richard Blanchard is one that we can sing with her as we lay down our burdens and let Jesus be the one to fill our cup.

Like the woman at the well, I was seeking - For things that could not satisfy. And then I heard my Savior speaking— "Draw from My well that never shall run dry."

Fill my cup, Lord; I lift it up, Lord; Come and quench this thirsting of my soul. Bread of Heaven, feed me till I want no more. Fill my cup, fill it up, and make me whole."






