*From Father Libby*

Dear All,

So, my sister and her fam have moved back from Alaska after thirty years to Michigan, which is great. I have found that I am now the designated go-to person to take care of her two animals whenever she travels: one cat (we never had one growing up) named Sunshine (they had two other cats named Midnight and Noonan) and one dog (a purebred lab that was one inch too short to be a show dog, so she got him cheap) named Crowley. You probably will never see Sunshine, but Crowley should make an appearance here and there; he is up now and will be again in October. It's been fun remembering what it is like to have a dog around again.

Looking at a Dog's Life through metaphysical eyes now thirty years after last having one, it struck me how different life would be if we knew we only had ten (or seventeen) years to live. Crowley, I've found, is either on or off. Though an irrational animal, he lives as though he needs to make his time count. How much more should we! What I was reflecting on was that if we only had a couple of years after being born until we were grown-ups, then a span of five or so years of good health, and then were already into old age and death closing in, we might live very differently, mightn't we? Death is always just around the corner, but not something we should be afraid of. Rather, like Crowley, who does it instinctively, we should make life count.

A dog's nose (I've heard bears have even better noses than dogs) is like a bonanza of sense information. I think Crowley is somewhat blind—dogs have bad eyesight, I know, but if I don't throw the ball just where he is looking, he can't 'see' it. But he sure can smell. When we go for walks, it is like I get to see reality 'through his nose.'

Everything is just exploding all around him. And yet all of that is nothing compared to the ecstasy of heaven that (unfortunately) he will never know: All dogs do not go to heaven; in fact, no dogs do *because they can't choose*. Choice is what makes us immortal.

This weekend, this Sunday, July 17, we celebrate the Martyrs of Compiegne, who, by their offering, ended the French Revolution, or, better said, the Reign of Terror. Young Carmelite nuns in the prime of their lives who voluntarily went to the guillotine *chose* to do so by making of themselves an offering. It's funny to think that a simple act of the will can make such a difference in such a natural process. Crowley, my sister's dog, is going to die just as sure as those nuns did, but those nuns had the great opportunity, of which they took advantage, to make *an act of the will* that my sister's dog Crowley will never be able to make. They made their lives count for the immortality of heaven, not just simply an explosion of sense information for ten or seventeen years, as most of the world now lives for (and, like the beasts, will be destroyed, cf. psalm 49:12). Now, the good thing is, Crowley can't go to hell, because he simply cannot 'choose.' He only follows instinct, whereas, for humans, our choices are what make us immortal, either for heaven or hell. So, Crowley will go out of existence in another four to eleven or so years, but we, when we die, will continue to live, either in heaven or hell.

In other words, we have a great opportunity—not only to live forever, which we all will because we all make choices, either good or bad, but we have the opportunity to offer up our

lives to God as a living sacrifice, pleasing to Him (cf Romans 12:1) as those Carmelite nuns did, who helped to save France. Let's make our lives count in the short few years we have!

Chant camp this week, big thanks to all who are involved in that. Learning to chant is so important for our youth and for the propagation of the faith. It is amazing what our youth can do. Also, early bird drawing this weekend for the raffle! Get your tickets in before Sunday for the drawing!
