#### From Father Libby

Hello All, Blessed Trinity Sunday!

I thought you'd enjoy seeing the letter I put in the time capsule that was buried June 7.

Dear Pastor of Holy Rosary, 2072

The Lord's Peace! Enjoy the contents of this time capsule. I (Fr Donald Libby) have been the pastor of Holy Rosary now from 2009-2022 (was associate with Fr Michael Janowski from 2007-2009). I arrived when Deacon Muggenburg was the administrator and Fr Garth Hilmer would come to say masses basically only on the weekends-a bit of a sad state after what had always been a flourishing parish with many vocations, religious and for the priesthood. The school had closed in 1996, a terrible blow to the community amid some question exactly of why it was closing. The Felician Nuns had left about 10 years before after all their decades of sacrificial service. The Gas Station/convenience store south of the parish on what in 2022 is Dave Rosinski's property disappeared before my time and at present, there are on that location only a couple old barns (due south), one also kitty corner (southeast), a beautiful rental house across the street (due East, Gatzke family's old house. Mike used to come over and ring the angelus bell from that house which in my time is mechanized, but we also restored the rope to be able to ring it at the consecration), and next to that a red house, our only fulltime neighbor (northeast). To the north is farmland on both sides of the street, save of course for our cemetery. We bought an extra plot to double its size a couple years ago; at my time the original cemetery is about 10 years from being full. To the south, forest and a pine tree line just behind the grotto of Our Lady and our garden, and the old barn (that would be interesting to know if the barn is still there at your time—we hope so!). Our beautiful new pavilion was just by our new Bishop Jeffrey Walsh, sitting just behind the convent/office/adoration chapel building (built in 1955). We're redoing all the brickwork on the school at present—it should be good till you open this capsule but you'd better get an assessment on that in 2072, along with the other buildings (we did the brick on the Church around 2015—and the slate roof on the Church should still be good for quite some time to come). The basketball court I would imagine has either been redone or replaced (it doubles as our hockey rink). The old mausoleum-is that still there (due north past the soccer field) when I arrived they still used it for such sometimes, but now it is a storage building to keep the gas away from the other buildings, etc). Hope the septic field is still working and all the underground pipes, wires etc; we've tried to keep maps for you of that.

The parish is thriving. Seven kids for confirmation this year (usually somewhere around twelve, not bad for a parish that has about 120 families that come each week, many more than that 'on the books'). We have two weekend ordinary form masses, 4pm Saturday and 8am Sunday (add a 9:25 in the summer). The extraordinary form of the mass (11am) is well attended after Pope Benedict XVI asked that it be offered, and Bishop Cooney asked me to start it here. This year we have two young men graduating (out of eight graduates) interested in the priesthood; David Witkowski just got accepted to the diocese and Gabe Maday who will first go to a four year college; we also have Jake Belanger who is in college seminary. Maybe one of them will be you reading this letter. I hope you find this—one parishioner, Trina Pleva (hopefully her descendants are still in the parish) mentioned how their class did a time capsule, but when they went to dig it up at first no one remembered where it was and a road had been built over it. So many questions I'd like to ask you, look me up (I'll be 102); by 2072 you'll probably be able to google or whatever exactly what nursing home I'm in if I'm not rattling around some parish as the old monsignor/associate, or maybe by then they will have longevity pills

and...I will be reading this letter myself. Keep the faith, and pass on the tradition.

Busy weekend...family retreat going on so please remember the 9:15 mass is for that this weekend (9:15 will start regularly soon). You can still come, but it will be longer than usual. The 11am might start a couple minutes late/rosary might need to start a bit late.
